# Advanced Certificate in Tribal Court Legal Advocacy

### **2024 Application Requirements**

Thank you for your interest in applying for the National Tribal Trial College Advanced Certificate in Tribal Court Legal Advocacy. Please complete the following application by April 5, 2024 and submit the following documents:

- 1. Completed and signed application form.
- 2. Current Résumé or Curriculum Vitae (CV).
- **3.** A signed letter of recommendation from a Tribal Court Judge, Prosecutor, Opposing Counsel, or Civil Legal Services provider describing your legal representation of victims since graduation from the NTTC.

Please make sure that you have submitted all of the necessary documents. Students who apply or complete their applications after the deadline will be considered on a space available basis. Incomplete applications will be considered after completed applications have been reviewed. Applicants will be notified of their application status on or before April 23, 2024. The online course will begin on May 13, 2024 and will end on July 1, 2024. The mandatory, final interactive training (on-site course) will be held July 31- August 2, 2024 in Madison, Wisconsin. Although the course is tuition-free, students will be responsible for their own travel and lodging costs for the on-site course at the University of Wisconsin Law School.

If you have any questions about expenditure of OVW grant funds, please contact your OVW program manager.

The in-person training will be held from July 31- August 2, 2024 at the University of Wisconsin Law School in Madison, Wisconsin. To participate in the graduation ceremony and to receive a Certificate, students must be on time each day and be present for all 32 hours of the in-person training.
