Thank you for your interest in applying for the National Tribal Trial College Certificate in Tribal Court Legal Advocacy. Please complete the following application and submit the following documents:

1. Completed and signed application form
2. Current resume or Curriculum Vitae (CV)
3. A signed letter from the clerk of your Tribal Court or current sitting Tribal Court Judge, *written on Tribal Court letterhead*, attesting that you will be allowed to practice in the specified Tribal Court once you successfully complete the Certificate in Tribal Court Legal Advocacy.

Note: Your tribe may have additional requirements, such as passage of a Tribal Bar Exam

Please make sure that you have submitted all required documents. Students who apply or complete their applications after the deadline will be considered on a space available basis. Incomplete applications will be considered after completed applications have been reviewed. Applicants will be notified of their application status on or before **January 17, 2025**. The online course will begin on **February 3, 2025**. The mandatory final 40 hours of interactive training will be an on-site course in Madison Wisconsin from **July 21-25, 2025** at the University of Wisconsin Law School.

Students are responsible for their own travel and lodging costs for the on-site week in Madison, WI. It is recommended that you have your supervisor's / Grant Manager's assurance there will be travel, lodging costs and per diem available.
